CLINTON TOWNSHIP, Mich. – L'Anse Creuse High School – North student Zachary Fuller was selected to participate in the Law Enforcement Career Academy, a Michigan State Police program that includes activities and seminars for students exploring careers in law enforcement. Fuller was sponsored by the Clinton Township chapter of the Kiwanis Club based on his grades, moral character, and sincere desire to pursue a career in law enforcement, as well as an interview with Kiwanis representatives.

The program, which will be held over six days in July, includes activities and seminars for students to learn about various aspects of law enforcement, such as traffic law, crime lab and forensic science, water safety, military drill, criminal tracking demonstrations, patrolling, defensive tactics, first aid, discussions with emergency support team (SWAT), alcohol abuse, underwater recovery, narcotics and dangerous drugs, and leadership skills. The program's main goal is to prepare students to make informed career choices by giving them a firsthand look at the responsibilities of law enforcement officials.

After completing the program, Fuller will present what he has learned to his sponsors at the Kiwanis Club. This is an exciting opportunity for Fuller, who is interested in studying law enforcement in college and becoming a police officer.
