Students Not Feeling Well

You do not need to call to report that your student has tested positive for Covid-19. Absences will be marked based on the information provided in the reporting form.

SchoolPay

LCPS has transitioned from PaySchools to SchoolPay for parents/guardians to purchase school related items for their student. SchoolPay can be accessed through your parent portal account. **NOTE:** SchoolPay can only be accessed when logging on to your parent portal through a desktop computer or a browser. Visitors During School Hours

PLEASE BE ADVISED: Visitors entering LCHS during school hours (this includes parents, guardians and volunteers), <u>MUST</u> enter the building through the Commons doors. Visitors <u>MUST</u> stop and checkin at the Commons Desk inside the front doors to receive a Visitor's Pass before entering the main building.

Staff Parking Lot

As a reminder, the back parking lot is reserved for **STAFF ONLY Monday-Friday 5:30am-3:00pm**. Parent/Students are prohibited from using this parking lot during these days/times. Violators will be subject to ticketing.

Parents, please take a moment to review the **STUDENT** <u>DROP-OFF</u> & <u>PICK-UP</u> **PROCEDURES** effective immediately. For the safety of all students, staff & parents, your cooperation with following these procedures is greatly appreciated. Individuals not following these procedures are subject to ticketing.

Parking Permits

If your student drives a vehicle to school, a Parking Permit is required. Parking Permits are \$30.00 & are processed electronically only. In order for a parking permit to be issued to your student, please complete the following. Payment and all of the required information must be submitted before a parking permit will be issued.

- Login into your parent portal to access SchoolPay to pay for your parking permit
- Access the <u>22-23 Parking Permit Form</u>, completing the required areas and submitting pictures of the students driver's license

- and the vehicle registration of each vehicle that needs to be permitted.
- The parking permit will be distributed to your student during school once it is processed.

LCHS Athletic Event Policies-PLEASE REVIEW!

Please make sure to review the policies/rules for all Athletic Events in the "CLUBS/ATHLETICS" Section.

- ALL STUDENTS MUST have their student ID to enter any Athletic Event (or any building event outside of normal school hours). NO ID=NO ENTRY.
- There is an entry fee for all Athletic Events. The entry fee is for adults & students. If your student is denied entry, they are expected to leave the premises.

- Building entry for Athletic Events is through the front of the building only. If a spectator parks in the back parking lot, they must walk around to the front of the building for entry.
- Children under high school age WILL NOT will be permitted into events unless accompanied by an adult. The adult is expected to stay for the entire event.

LCHS Athletic Passes/Admission Prices

There is a \$5 admission fee for all events. Children under the age of 10 & Adults age 62 & over are free. Athletic Passes from school year 21-22 are not accepted. Passes are currently available for purchase through SchoolPay.

Away Game Admission Policies

- Payment protocols vary by school. Please make sure you check the away school's website for information on how to obtain entry at their facility. Some schools require entry purchase online <u>BEFORE</u> the event.
- Students are <u>REQUIRED</u> to have their actual ID when attending an away game. Most schools <u>WILL NOT</u> accept a photo copy of an ID, picture of an ID, a coach or LCHS staff member vouching for the student or bringing up their profile in PowerSchool. Students that do not have an actual ID will not be permitted entry into the game. This is per the away school's policy.

Sports Physicals

Physical forms can be found on the <u>LC Athletics Website</u>. A sports physical is considered valid if a parent/guardian signature appears in sections 2,3 & 4. **NOTE: Students must have a Sports Physical dated after April 15, 2023 *NOTE NEW DATE* from this point on in order to participate in sports for the School Year 22-23.**

Senior Fines/Diploma Holds

Fines that are not paid prior to graduation will result in a diploma hold for your Senior. Fines can be for, but not limited to: school textbooks, chromebooks, athletic equipment, Band/Choir/Art equipment, failure to paint over their painted parking spot, unpaid parking permit, etc. A diploma hold will also be issued to Seniors that do not meet their community service requirement or curriculum requirement. **NOTE:** if your Senior has a diploma hold, your student's final transcript will not be released until the diploma hold has been lifted.

Cap & Gown Pickup

If your Senior was unable to pick up their order, they can pick up their order with Mrs. Kopczyk in the Main Office.

Senior Yard Signs

If you ordered a Senior Yard Sign to honor your Class of 2023 Grad, signs are available for pick up <u>AFTER SCHOOL ONLY</u> in Room 136 after school from 2:25pm-2:40pm.

Senior Textbook Collection

Textbooks will be collected from Seniors during their 4th hour on Monday, May 15th & Tuesday, May 16th. Seniors need to make sure they have their textbooks with them on these days. Students that do not turn in books that were issued to them are subject to a diploma hold.

Senior Chromebook Collection

Chromebooks will be collected from Seniors during their English class on Friday, May 19th & Monday, May 22nd. Seniors need to make sure they have their chromebooks with them on these days. Students that do not turn in their chromebook (including the case & charge cord)

are subject to a diploma hold.

Senior's Painted Parking Spots Clean-Up-DEADLINE NEXT WEEK!

It's time for the Seniors to clean-up the student parking lot! If your Senior painted a parking spot this year, they must paint over their parking spot with black paint by Friday, May 19th. Once the parking spot has been blacked out, Seniors need to 1) take a picture that includes the spot # in the picture 2) bring the picture to Mr. Doroh in Room 136 or email the picture to him that includes the student's name & spot # in the subject line. Students that do not meet this deadline will be charged a \$40 fine and receive a diploma hold. Once the fine is paid, the diploma hold will be lifted for the painting of the parking spot. NOTE: If the student pays their fine, the student is not obligated to paint over their spot with black paint. If you have any questions, please email Mr. Doroh.

- Seniors are to arrive to the LCHS Commons between 8:30am-8:45am with their graduation gown only. NO CAPS/TASSELS PLEASE!
- Parents are welcome to attend and should arrive to the building between 8:40am-8:45am, entering through Door #40 (this door is in the front of the building by the Media Center).
- At the end of the walk, Seniors will be directed into the Large Gym for their Class Picture. This is for Senior students only! At that time, parents can exit the building through Door #40, as we will be preparing for school dismissal at 10:30am. College ABLE

Macomb Community College is excited to announce that we will be offering an academic catch-up program this summer called College ABLE (Academic Boost for Learning Experiences)! This program is part of a state-wide initiative administered by the Michigan Community College Association, to help combat learning loss among recent high school graduates who experienced interruptions to in-person learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic. That said, the program is open to ALL students who plan to begin college in Fall 2023! The program will provide students the opportunity to better prepare themselves for math and English courses, as well as connect them with valuable student support knowledge and tools to ensure their success. Students can choose from one of the three 4-week sessions offered during the summer semester:

- May 22-June 16
- June 19-July 14
- July 17-August 11

WHO: Any new student who wants to enhance their confidence and skills in math and English (Unfortunately dual enrollment/early college students are NOT eligible for this program)

WHERE: Hybrid options include online sessions and in-person meetings at South or Center Campuses

WHEN: Students will choose the session they prefer – and will then select from morning or evening options at South or Center Campus
