Ideas for Qualifications for Automotive Collision and Refinishing Skills:

- Knowledge of all steps involved in the preparation and painting of an automobile.
- Successfully perform major body alignment and straighten frames.
- Able to use air compressed power tools and equipment.
- Skilled in ARC, MIG/TIG, and oxyacetylene welding.
- Able to bump and fill depressions utilizing plastic body and filler.
- Experience with surface preparation and paint application.
- Efficiently diagnose/troubleshoot problems and plan steps to repair.
- Proficient repairing and replacing mechanical parts.
- Familiar with shop safety rules and procedures.
- Complies with federal, state and local regulations concerning hazardous waste, OSHA and Right to Know laws.
- Experience using the following tools: (list tools related to auto body) MIG, TIG and arc welders, etc.
- Basic knowledge of Oxy-Acetylene Torch Welding.
- Knowledge of Metric /Standard conversions.
- Able to interpret vendor catalogs and troubleshoot problem areas using service manuals.
- Able to identify and use tools and shop equipment efficiently.
- Maintains clean and safe work environment.
- Skilled in removing/replacing upholstery, accessories, electrical and hydraulic window and seat operating equipment, and trim.
- Holds a valid driver's license.
- Certificate of Achievement in Automotive Collision Repair, XYZ Place, 2014.

Work History or Experience:

If no official work history, include co-op/externships opportunities, class related volunteer experiences or projects, and any course related knowledge/activities or professional experience you may have acquired or been recognized for.

This information <u>could</u> also be highlighted as <u>Experience</u>, <u>Education or Accomplishments</u>. Always briefly include who, what, where and when or how your actions improved or contributed to the situation or organization.

- 1. Keep your Resume to **ONE PAGE with 1 inch margins on all sides.** If you are running onto page 2 then try reformatting, refining statements and taking a second look to see if you are repeating information. Always have someone proofread your work before ever submitting your resume to an potential employer.
- 2. Only include the most relevant skills and accomplishments which will impress a potential employer or will be useful to the job you are applying for.
- 3. Include volunteer experience and accomplishments when: you have very little to no experience at all, if the experience is related to the job, or if your experiences will be in someway beneficial to note.
