- Classroom training in the licensed "Teens for Tots" preschool program.
- Strong knowledge of child development and education theories and practices.
- Wide knowledge of safe and appropriate activities for students.
- Knowledge of classroom management techniques such as;
- First Aid / CPR certified (20XX).
- Experience as a teacher aide in "Teens for Tots" preschool program working with students ages 2-4 years old.
- Hands-on teaching experience in the licensed "Teens for Tots" preschool laboratory.
- Over 3 years experience babysitting children ages 3 to 5 years old.
- Developed appropriate written lesson plans for classroom activities.
- Keeps accurate and timely records on student files and student progress.
- Performed lesson activities with preschool aged children.
- Knowledge of guidance & discipline principles.

- 1. Keep your Resume to **ONE PAGE with 1 inch margins on all sides.** If you are running onto page 2 then try reformatting, refining statements and taking a second look to see if you are repeating information. Always have someone proofread your work before ever submitting your resume to a potential employer.
- 2. Only include the most relevant skills and accomplishments which will impress a potential employer or will be useful to the job you are applying for.
- 3. Include volunteer experience and accomplishments when: you have very little to no experience at all, if the experience is related to the job, or if your experiences will be in some way beneficial to note.
