an accurate assessment of what skills each student is ready to take on next.

Our staff and students are not only spending time refocusing on academics this month, but also revisiting classroom and schoolwide expectations for positive behavior. I am asking for the support and assistance of all parents to join our staff in consistently pushing the message of positive and successful behavior to our students. Parents, please be reminded that our students **will go out** to recess during the winter months as fresh air and exercise are so important for children. Please make sure that your student is sent to school dressed appropriately for the weather. If the temperature falls below 10 degrees Fahrenheit, we will keep students indoors. Following the guide above when preparing students for school during the winter months is suggested. Thanks!

Just a few of the wellness benefits of outdoor play:

• Kids who spend more time outdoors are more physically active, and there is no shortage of research that physical activity drives positive health outcomes.

• Doctors also know daily doses of fresh air and sunlight increase circulation, vitamin D, boost immune systems, and promote overall wellness. We parents know it too when we look at happy kids who sleep soundly and just look healthier.

• Time spent in natural settings also contributes to healthy sleep patterns in babies, toddlers and kids. And proper sleep drives all kinds of beneficial health outcomes.

•Kids who spend time outdoors get sick less often. The perception that you'll catch a cold outside is just plain wrong. Stagnant, indoor environments are breeding and sharing grounds for all kinds of germs, and some studies show that being cold may even trigger the immune system.

•Nature and play bring joy: Learning to find and experience that joy s another way to give children enriching, positive emotional experiences that they can carry forward into the world.

Please note that students who arrive **after 8:51 AM are considered tardy**. Teachers take attendance at that time and will mark your student absent. If a student arrives later and is NOT SIGNED IN they



could be marked with an absence. To avoid this happening, parents/guardians are REQUIRED to walk their student into the building and sign them in on the clipboard outside of the office. This allows us to see the student has arrived and change their absence to a tardy. Please DO NOT just drop your student off without walking them in and signing them in. We understand that there are occasions when your student may be late, however, please keep in mind that chronic tardiness will cause your student to miss valuable instructional time as well as disruptions to the learning environment.


